FHS Falcon Society kicks off Phase II of fund-raiser

It takes both a team and a community to complete school projects. "The Farmington High Falcon Society and outstanding parent run-support group is getting ready to start Phase II of its ambitious plan to revamp the school's sports and band practice fields in order to maximize their potential," said John Barrett, Farmington High School principal. "Because FHS is land locked with limited space for playing fields, it has become necessary to redesign the athletic facilities to make space for the school's extensive sports and band program." To set the tone, representatives of 14 FHS sports, an administrator, a school liaison officer and a school board member, posed for a "Team

Farmington High" photo Sept. 16 in front of the school. The mood was exuberant. "Totally awesome, yo," said Iden Baghdadi, the drum major. "No diggity." No diggity means "Indeed!" Baghdadi explained. The goal of the Society is to provide ideas and financial support to school projects which promote the development of healthy individuals and lifelong learners. The Society is an ongoing effort to help create a solid foundation for the future of all Farmington High students and the community. The Falcon Society recently finished Phase I, which involved constructing a brick plaza, installing new wrought iron fence work, remodeling the press box, putting finishing touches on the concessions stand and updating the tennis court viewing area. "The Falcon Society raised

more than \$200,000 to pay for Phase I, which does not include thousands of dollars worth of donated labor and materials. The Society is kicking off plans for "Our Farmington High - Our Town, Our Community, Our High School," the 2nd annual gala dinner dance and auction, 6:30 p.m.-12:30 a.m. Friday, November 22 at Vladimir's, 28125 Grand River in Farmington Hills. Proceeds will go towards the Phase II outdoor facilities project. The ticket price is \$50. The 50/50 raffle winner will be announced at 10 p.m. The two winners need not be present to win. A silent auction is also planned at the dance. Last year's Falcon Society dinner dance helped to raise \$30,000. The fun went to the facilities and athletic fields. "Let's remember that FHS is

not just our children's school, it's our community's school as well," said Boskey and Kahrnoff in a flyer. "Our facilities are used by organizations such as South Farmington Baseball, the Farmington Rockets Football, cheerleading teams and Special Olympics." No donation is too small, they say, and can be made in a family's name.
