

Twisters take 3rd North Division crown

The Michigan Twisters captured their third consecutive North Division Championship Saturday at Willow Run's Devin Stadium, with a 53-6 routing of inter-state rival, the Southwest Michigan Rage.

The Twisters defense controlled the game limiting the Rage to 82 yards of total offense.

Southwest Michigan was never able to mount a rushing attack, carrying 22 times for negative yardage. The Twisters recovered five fumbles, one for a safety and another for a touchdown, by linebacker Kam Watson (Rommel).

This season also played a big part in the victory for the Twisters. The Rage was only able

to complete six passes on the day. Aaron Brothers (Canton) picked off a pass and returned it 41 yards for a score. The Michigan offense pounded away at the Rage scoring three touchdowns on the ground. Runningback Jason Gibson (Milan) scored twice and leading rusher, Jaquan Wright (Ypsilanti) scored from ten yards out. Wright ended the day with 70 yards on seven carries. The Twisters have a chance to finish the season undefeated with their last game against the Southern Michigan Storm. The game is Saturday at Morenci.

CITY OF FARMINGTON OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN NOTICE OF ZONING ORDINANCE ADOPTION

Pursuant to Michigan Public Act 207 of 1921, as amended (the City and Village Zoning Act), notice is hereby given that an amended Zoning Ordinance regulating the development and use of land in the City of Farmington has been adopted by the City Council of the City of Farmington on September 16, 2002. Copies of the ordinance may be obtained from the City Clerk's office at Farmington City Hall, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan 48335.

The revisions to the Zoning Ordinance include extensive changes throughout the document such as:

- A reorganization of the format.
- Updates to site plan review, rezoning, special land use and planned unit development (PUD) procedures and standards.
- A renaming of the R10 One-family Office and ERO Education, Research and Office Districts to OS Office Service District.
- Changes to the Zoning Map to reflect the new zoning districts and revised district names.
- Updates to the list of uses by zoning districts.
- Revisions to the single-family zoning district dimensional standards.
- Significant revisions to regulations for non-conforming buildings, structures, lots, uses and sites.
- New standards for infill single-family development and site design.
- Refinement of parking regulations, such as changes to the number of required parking spaces.
- Revision to the landscape regulations.
- Revisions for Board of Zoning appeals, variance criteria, ordinance administration and ordinance enforcement procedures and standards.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on Monday, August 12, 2002 to receive comment on the draft revision to the entire City Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map. The first reading of the Zoning Ordinance was held at a City Council meeting on September 3, 2002. This ordinance was adopted by the City Council on September 16, 2002 and is ordered to take effect ten (10) days following publication of this notice of adoption.
