three times as many shots (21-7) in the first quarter. Harrison had just a 10-6 lead at the end.

"We turned the ball over too much tonight," Carruthers said. "That's been one of our Achilles heels, especially with-out (injured) Jehan (Hindo) because she's another guard who can handle the ball."

The Hawks scored the first 14 points of the second half and built their lead to 37-9, which was enough to withstand a comeback by the Raiders.

Kristen Terres made back-to-back threes during the Harrison run; Condell scored twice inside, and Lacey and Ross added a pair of dunks. "Early in the game they did a lot to take Maggie out of it," Harrison coach Pete Mantyla said. "They tried to limit her touches in the high post. We tried to run some things through the short corner, and I think they were ready for that."

"Britney, Katie and the (Terres) twins all made some big shots and forced them to change what they were doing."

The Hawks (6-6) missed the presence of freshman Kayla Conden in their lineup, too, Mantyla added. Conden suffered a concussion in a Tuesday game but is expected to return this week.

"For us it was a big change," Mantyla said. "We played a lot of different combinations. As coaches we really noticed her absence. She can hit perimeter shots; she goes to the basket and inbounds the ball a lot for us."

Harrison's shooting cooled after the fast start in the third quarter, and North had the momentum for the remainder of the game.

The Raiders whittled away at the deficit, outscoring the Hawks 19-3 over the final 11 minutes and 13-2 in the fourth quarter. Christy Stockton and Kristen McErlan scored 10 points apiece to lead North (2-8). Stockton had eight in the second half and McErlan seven.

"The kids never gave up," Carruthers said. "They were working as hard as they could the whole time, even when they were down."

"You could see in their body language they were still trying to work at things. I felt like we were in the game all the way to the end."

from the floor (15-of-52) and North 30 percent (11-of-37). The Hawks made five of 24 three-point attempts and the Raiders one of six. North, which had 23 turnovers, sank five of nine free throws, and Harrison was 5-of-11 at the line.

"We weren't happy with the last five, six minutes of the game," Mantyla said, adding the Hawks should have been celebrating another public school city championship.

"We didn't play well the last part of the game, and the girls are not happy about that. North outplayed us in the fourth quarter. I don't think

any of us were comfortable with the way the game finished."

MERCY 62, BENEDECTINE 41: The Marlins turned a five-point halftime lead into a rout Thursday by outscoring the host Ravens in the second half, 34-18.

Barb Maczka scored a game-high 14 points to lead Mercy; Whitney Johnson added 10, Vanessa Turner nine, Dior Harris and Anne Roosevelt eight apiece. Turner and Roosevelt also had seven rebounds each. The Marlins had quarter leads of 13-9, 28-23 and 47-31. Mercy is 3-1 in the Catholic League Central Division and 6-3 overall.
