30 with 5:06 to play. Ryan Copacia ran 23 yards on a counter and set up a 12-yard TD pass by Mike Jones to Patrick McConahy with 3:47 on the clock.

Jones was nearly sacked but eluded one tackle and was in the grasp of another defender when he spotted McConahy in the end zone.

"It was a three-step quick drop pass," Jones said. "The tight end wasn't open and neither was the tailback. I looked to the back side, and the wide receiver was almost wide open by himself."

Adams had a 14-0 halftime lead and was in control of the game, but Harrison put 21 points on the board in a span of just 3:21 to take the lead.

Following six straight running plays, Harrison quarterback Jake Ghannam passed 44 yards to wide-open tight end Kyle Taylor for a touchdown. Bill Kollias kicked the first of three PATs.

The Highlanders got fancy on the kickoff, trying to deceive the Hawks with hand-offs deep in their territory.

It resulted in a fumble, which Harrison's Charlie Gass recovered at the 9. Marcus Woods, who gained 148 yards on 38 carries, scored on the next play, and it was suddenly a tie game.

Then, Mike Bartley intercepted a Jones pass, and Harrison had the ball again at the Adams 35. A 26-yard, Ghannam-to-Adam Grisdale pass set up a 1-yard TD run by Woods at 9:10 in the fourth quarter. The Hawks were on top for the first time, 21-14.

"We had the game in hand and gave it away," Harrison coach John Herrington said. "I'm proud of the way the kids came back, after doing nothing in the first half, to take the lead in the second."

"But then having two 15-yard penalties is inexcusable. We had the ball and all we had to do was get another first down, and the delay penalty hurt us."

"Then the thing that has hurt us all year, a lack of discipline, cost us the ballgame. Overall, they probably outplayed us, but we had a chance to win the game."

In the first half, Adams capitalized on an Alan Guy interception to take a 7-0 lead. Jones passed 27 yards to Matt Doyle, and LePage scored from the 1 on the next play.

The Highlanders drove 68 yards in seven plays in the second quarter for their second TD. Karl Daniel made a 37-yard gain after catching a screen pass on the first play, and LePage capped the drive

with another 1-yard dive at 7:32.

"I think we might have gone into the locker room believing we had the game under our belt a little too much," Jones said. "We bent ourselves in a way with the interception and the fumble. But we fought back. It tested our heart and we were able to get the win."

Jones was 6-of-17 passing for 110 yards, Ghannam 4-of-16 for 76. Adams outgained Harrison on the ground, 159-136, and in total yardage, 269-212.
