It's design and that of Shiraz are not at all simi-lar but there are some interest-ing Shiraz twists on the popular menu items at No.VI. The Shiraz appetizer Lobster Vivice-Stuffed Baked Potatoes is a spin off of No.VI Lobster Mashed Potatoes. Shiraz, however, has many more lobster dishes than No.VI.

No.VI. Among appetizers, Scafood Martinis feature large prawns, priced by the piece, served with both mango chili sauce and tra-ditional cocktail sauce.

Offering an Asian kiss is Oysters Nobu, Barnett's tribute to celebrated chef Nobu Matsuhisa, world-renowned for his new-style Japanese cooking. Seared Sirloin Sashimi with ginger, soy and wasabi served on a

banana leaf is another of Barnett's Asian inspirations.
