

K'zoo judge accepts MHSAA's plan

On Friday (Nov. 8), the United States District Court in Kalamazoo accepted the compliance plan submitted by the Michigan High School Athletic Association to reschedule its postseason tournaments consistent with the District Court's opinion and order of last August.

Unless the MHSAA prevails on appeal, it will reschedule its Lower Peninsula Colf and Tensis tournaments. moving

senats tournaments, moving girls tennis and boys golf from

fall to spring and boys tennis and girls golf from spring to fall. The MHSAA will offer Upper Pennisula soccer tourna-ments for boys in the spring and girls in the fall. This configuration compiles with the Court's Aug. I Injunctive Order, states the Final Injunctive Order issued on Nov. 8. Girls basketball and volley-

Girls basketball and volleyball seasons would also be reversed by the Court's order of Aug. 1.


