"Our line is kind of short and squatty, so we have our smaller and faster kids at tackle," said Giannone. "We figure if we're going to throw, we'll put our athletes on the outside.

And that's the kind of thinking that gives defenses fits.

To stop that, we have to get pressure on (Thoel) and disrupt

his reads and get some fresh bodies in there, said Mach. 'You have to mix them up on defense and keep them off bal-ance, instead of them keeping us off balance. You want to stay a step ahead of them, instead of them staying a step ahead of
