The Oakland County Drain Commission recently became the first public works department in the country to be registered with the International Organization for Standardization (18O). To receive the 1SO 9002 designation, the drain commission and its 226 employees had to document all work processes and procedures. Up to now, the standard has been used primarily in the private industry.

Based in Switzerland, 1SO oversees the network of

oversees the network of national standard institutes

for more than 130 countries, and publishes standards for quality management. Standards are documented agreements containing technical specifications and other criteria to be used consistently as rules and guidelines. According to Oakland County Drain Commissioner John McCulloch, obtaining the ISO designation will ensure consistency in both operations and eustomer service.

"This process offered everyone in the department the opportunity to take a
