never know it. He can continue to keep it going." Doyle played at Rochester High School last year as a sophomore and played his freshman season in Indiana.

MARK FEENEY (Lahser): Feeney is an OAA Scholar Athlete and a first-team OAA Division 1 selection. A four-year member of the Lahser golf team, Feeney fired a 78 on the first day of the Division 2 state championship tournament and came back on Saturday to shoot the low round of the day with an even-par 72. His 150 total netted him a seventh-place finish at the state meet. "Mark saved his best for last with his performance at the state meet," said Lahser coach Jan Luedtke.

DAN GORDON (Groves): In his second varsity season, Gordon placed among the top seven golfers in every tournament this year except one. He was first overall in OAA Division II play by tying for first in the first league tournament and placing second in the second league tournament. The Groves senior was fourth overall with a round of 72 in leading Groves to the Oakland County Division 2 tournament title. He averaged 37 in dual meets, including a low round of 33 against Seaholm. He was low medalist in four duals for the Falcons. "Dan has worked real hard, played in a lot of tournaments over the year and was a very consistent player," said Groves coach Jim Crosby. "He's spent a lot of time developing his game and that's what you have to do to compete at that level. He's hunting for par around every hole."

DAVID KOCH (Harrison): Koch is a three-year letterwinner and was Harrison's top golfer all season. He averaged 77.0 in 12 tournaments and 38.6 in seven dual meets. In his 12 tournaments, Koch had seven top-8 finishes and was medalist at one of the OAA Division II tournaments with an even-par 71. The Harrison junior shot a 73 at the state regional tourney and finished the season with a 79-80 at the state finals. He was selected to the OAA All-League team.

BRETT TAYLOR (Adams): In his first varsity season, Taylor averaged 79.1 in tournaments and 39.0 in duals. The Highlander junior was medalist in the first OAA Division 1 tournament at Bald Mountain. He was Adams' low scorer at both the regional

(he tied for fifth) and the state meet. "Brett was an extremely consistent golfer. He was always in the 78-79 range," said Adams coach Jim Taylor. "He had only four double-bogey or worse all year and that's pretty incredible. He's a very even-keeled kid who doesn't lose control or compose, and he has outstanding course management. But the number one factor is that he's a great kid and an outstanding young man - the best I've had in 30 years of coaching."

CHRIS WEBER (Country Day): Detroit Country Day's captain, Weber was his team's lone Division 3 state meet qualifier. The Country Day senior placed fifth in a regional that had four of the top-ten ranked teams in the state. While leading the Yellow Jackets to their first undefeated dual-meet season (6-0), Weber set a school record round of 34 on Country Day's home course at Oakland Hills Country Club. He finished with four top tens for the year. Weber plans to play varsity golf next year at Hillsdale College.

COACH OF YEAR

JIM CROSBY (Groves): It was one of those dream seasons for the

Birmingham Groves boys golf team coached by veteran Jim Crosby. The Falcons registered a 9-2 overall dual-meet record, including a 4-1 mark to win the Oakland Activities Association Division II dual-meet championship. Groves secured the overall OAA Division II title by winning both league meets. Crosby's squad also won the Oakland County Division 2 title with a fine score of 293. In other tournaments, Groves was second at the Birmingham Seaholm Twin Beach Invitational, sixth at the Pinckney Invitational and seventh at the state regional tournament. "The only bad day we really had was at the regional. We made some mistakes that cost us and that was disappointing," he said. "But overall we had a great season - a lot better year than we anticipated." Crosby said the key to the season was the Groves golfers all seemed to improve together. "I thought we'd be good, but it was just one of those years where everyone of the team seemed to improve at the same time. That doesn't happen too often," he said. "We had the same kids from a year ago who completely turned their games around. It was a fun season."
