WEST BLOOMFIELD TWP.

■ Road: Maple Road, Heather Heath Lane to Rutledge Park Street (between Orchard Lake and Middlebelt) — West Bloomfield Twp. is administering a project to add a center left-turn lane. Motorists should expect delays.

FRANKLIN VILLAGE / BLOOMFIELD TWP.

■ Road: 14 Mile, Telegraph to Franklin — This section of 14 Mile is closed so that the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department can install a water regulation chamber adjacent to the road. The detour route is Telegraph, Maple and Franklin. Motorists trying to

reach Franklin Cider Mill should use the detour route. Work is expected to be complete in January.

NOVI

■ Road: 12 Mile, from Meadowbrook to Novi, RCOC is widening this road to a four-lane boulevard. Partial completion (utilities installed/moved and temporary pavement down) by early December. Full completion is expected in 2003.

OAKLAND TOWNSHIP

■ Road: Gunn Road, at the intersection of Knobb Creek (east of Rochester Road) — The road commission is resurfacing Gunn over a culvert. Completion is expected Dec. 3.

SPRINGFIELD TWP.

■ Road: Dixie Highway, I-75 to Davisburg Road. The

RCOC is widening this road from four lanes to five. The road is open during construction. Completion is expected Dec. 15.

WATERFORD TWP.

■ Road: Elizabeth Lake Road, from Cass Lake to Cooley Lake roads. RCOC is widening this road from four lanes to five. The road is open to two-way traffic, but some side streets are closed at Elizabeth Lake. Work is expected to be complete by Dec. 1.

WEST BLOOMFIELD TWP.

■ Road: Maple Road, Heather Heath Lane to Rutledge Park Street (between Orchard Lake and Middlebelt) — West Bloomfield Township is administering a project to add a center left-turn lane. Motorists should expect delays. Completion is expected Dec. 3.
