THE OLD WAYS CAN STILL BE THE BEST WAYS
Every day we hear about the results of technology in medicine. An example is the announcement of a new type of coronary stent that will not clot just 3 years ago, stents were a novelty.
You are not out of line, to expect that such progress goes on everywhere in medicine. That is not true, in fact, this column will devote itself to praise soap and water. If you need to wash your hands, nothing gets better than soap and water, combined with patience and time.
If it is to work it must be done in a particular manner, and you must get to the leg ulcer as soon as possible. The ulcer should be cleaned three times a day by placing it under the spout of the bath tub. Then let water, at a warm and comfortable temperature, flow over the ulcer. During this time, squirt a small amount of liquid soap over the ulcer. Do not scrub the skin, let the water wash off the soap. After 5 minutes of washing in this way, let the ulcer air dry. Then cover it with a clean 4x4 gauze. You need not have the gauze sterile, that is an unnecessary expense. Cover the gauze with a kinkie wrap applied gently around the leg. Use a piece of tape to bind the ends of the wrap.
Repeat this procedure three times a day and do it every day.
This approach works by keeping the skin free of ornaments and salves that irritate the skin, using gentle means to keep the skin free of germs, and through dry drying, giving the tissue cells an incentive to grow.
