This is a voluntary process; however, accreditation is viewed as an important criterion by prospective students, graduate schools, and employers.
The Commission is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
The evaluation team will visit the college to gather evidence that the self-study is thorough and accurate. The team will then

make a recommendation to the Commission regarding the accreditation status of the col-lege and following a review process, the Commission itself will make a decision. The public is also invited to submit comments regarding the college and may forward them to:
