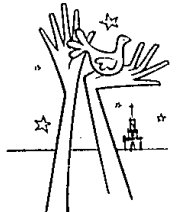

Your Comforting Hands



And he could do no mighty work there, except that he lay his hands upon a few sick people and healed them.

R.S.V. Mark 6:5

Our hands have the power to hurt, or help our fellow human beings. We can use them to tie and injure or to comfort and heal. While this is perhaps the most obvious of our carnal, profane powers, we are created to feel doctors are trained to feel doctors are trained to feel. It is really appropriate to ask of us, although most of us don't do around hitting each other, neither do we make the effort to put someone on the back or rub their shoulders in a way that sends warmth and affection. Understandably, many of us are justifiably hesitant to touch each other because we fear that our touching may be intrusive or inappropriate. When that is the case, it is usually okay to figure out. A person who doesn't want you to touch them, well, usually that's okay, usually it's just that you're not to touch them. The skin is the weakest organ in the human body, and it is surprisingly responsive to touch. We simply shouldn't be afraid to touch. We can feel someone's touch, we are proud of them, that we want to encourage them, or that we want them to get better. Our hands are intimately connected with our hearts and minds, and sometimes the best way to help someone that you love and care for them is by the comfort of your hand.
