In 2000 and 2002, he competed in racquetball with partner Leo Levenson, during the U.S. Transplant Games at Walt Disney World in Orlando, Fla. Communications Corporation, the parent company of the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers; a daughter, Christina of Mesa, Ariz. a former reporter for the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers; son, Tony (Christina) of Chandler, Ariz.; two granddaughters, Samantha and Madeline Fuoco; and sisters, Marianne Madonna, Kathy
