The AAS Gold Medal Flower-Award winner is an ornamen-tal millet B' Pupile Majesty," a new-to-the-garden plant. This award is the most prestigious honor given to a plant. This beauty grows from 3 to 5 feet tall when mature and isn't fussy about soil, as long as it's warm. Another desirable trait is the spike that appears golden with pollen then changes to shiny purple when the seed matures. That spike, when immature, can be used for floral arrange-ments; the seed spike can be used as bird food or outdoor decorations.

If grown indoors, the leaves will be green and the plant may not be as tall. Direct sunlight induces purple leaves. Wait until the soil is warm and it's warm outdoors before set-ting this millet in a sunhy gar-

ting this millet in a sunhy garden spot.
