FHPD prepared for Mercy protesters

Saturday evening's anticipated protest at Mercy High School has Farmington Hills Police Department beefing up its weekend duty schedule.

But Chief Bill Dwyer doesn't anticipate anything other than a peaceful challenge to Mercy officials' decision to reinstate the "Lunch with Gow Granholm" auction item for the "Night with the Stars" fund-raiser. Pro-life advocates, including the Stop Granholm Church & Tuth Project, have said they'll be out in force Saturday night.

"We don't anticipate any problems," Dwyer said. "We feel it'll be an orderly protest."

Officers will inform protest leaders what city ordinances require – no trespassing on school property (which is considered private), use sidewalks and entrances and exits must be kept open.
