Testosterene is also a female hormone so when it's suppressed, it can definitely have a negative effect on a woman's sexual drive, says Reame, a professor in the U-M School of Nursing and a research scientist in the U-M Reproductive Sciences Program. "Fortunately, for this special group of women where other psychosocial causes have been ruled out,

Some post-menopausal women who use hormone therapy have the option to take a combination estrogen-testosterone pill to help treat their low libido. According to Reame, women using such therapy, in addition to estro-gen replacement therapy, have experienced an improvement in their quality of life over and above the effect of using estrogen afone.

Now, the U-M study hopes to find out if another option, a testosterone patch, can bring the same relief to women with low sexual libido. The patch in higher dozes has already been used for several years to

bring relief to men experienc-ing low libido. In both men and women, there has yet to be a consensus on whether low libido is the result of nor-

disease.

The study, which is placebo controlled, will look closely at post-menopausal women who are currently taking hormones are currently taking hormones and are in a stable, monogamous sexual relationship.
Since libido varies from weman to woman, the study's participants will be asked to keep a journal while using the patch to measure its effectiveness.

ness. Addition, the study will look closely at the side effects and other benefits of testosterone therapy.

"Given the recent concerns raised by the finding of large national trials of long-term hormone therapy, we are especially interested in better defining the risks and benefits of short-term menopausal therapies for fits of short-term menopausal therapies for those women who cannot function without it, but who

Chronic conditions affect seniors' feet

plans to offer services to Oakland County in June 2003, Grisham is able to 2003, Grisham is able to snoonage others through her experience. Grisham cited alarming statistics: Fifty percent of 9-year-old girls have dieted, 80 percent of 10-year-olds, and in high school, 90 percent of women are on diets. And we know dieting is a precursor to eating disorders.

Bingham Farms general medicine practitioner, Dr. Jerry Nosanchuk, sees patients with eating disorders. Most of those he sees are binge-eaters, which refers to people who cat large amounts

of high-fitt, high-sugar foods but don't use compensatory actions such as vomiting to rid themselves of the extra calories. Binge-caters are obese, typically older, and include more men than in the anorexia/bullming groups. Thue anorexies are very sick people. They look emaciated, (and are) delusional, said Nosanchuk. They will look right at you and tell you they have fat. They are absolutely frightened about gaining weight.

Nosanchuk believes a combination of psychiatric, sociocultural and neuro-hormonal (brain hormones) factors contribute to eating disorders along with cultural factors and personality characteristics. Treatment includes medication and psychiatric treatment, And. though successful tics. Treatment includes med-ication and psychiatric treat-ment. And, though successful treatment depends on a patient's motivation, many lack it.

Nosanchuk said he has not had a lot of success with family participation, because sometimes the family is afraid to confront or upset the patient.

It's a control issue: They're (the patient) in control of their body, they have control of everybody. They control theotor, the family, said Nosanchuk. "When you hospitalize them, it's involuntary, but it's an art of compassion. keeping them alive against their will."
