HOW AFCI WORKS

AFCIs replace regular circuit breakers in your home's electric panel. They have a computer chip that mon-itors the elec-



in a fraction of a second.

Where a ground fault interrupter (GFI) protects your from a shock, an AFCI protects your house from a fire.

Normally, when a hot wire makes contact with ground or a neutral wire, there is enough current draw in the circuit to trip the breaker or blow a fuse. Problems can arise when this contact is not solid or intermittent, and then, an arc (or tent, and then, an arc (or spark) develops which could cause a fire.

Vour billfold until you are sure you don't have to return any of the objects. This works well for clothing ecceipts and household items.

Periodically go through your billfold and discard receipts ou no longer need. If you

accumulate too many for your billifold, use an envelope labeled Return Receipts.

B Receipts for items rarely returned:
Keep receipts for things like groceries and dry cleaning for a short period of time. You may need to return a grocery item or take back dry cleaning that wasn't pruperly cleaned. You may then discard these receipts if you don't need them for tax purposes.

You may then diseare tree receipts if you don't need them for tax purposes. If you get a receipt for renting movies, keep it as a reminder for when the movie needs to be returned - and then diseard it when you return the movie. If you don't know whether you should keep a receipt or not, ask yourself: My would you want to refer to it in the future?

If you want to remember the business for a later visit, put the information in your calendar or planner and diseard the receipt for a special event, put it with your mementos or scrapbooking items.

When you make a big pur-chase like a refrigerator, TV or stereo, you need to save the receipt for future warranty work.

For a TV or stereo equip-For a TV or stereo equipment, you can place the receipt in an envelope and tape the envelope to either the owner's manual or underneath the equipment. You can also make household files labeled Furniture, Kitchen, Electronics, Bikes, Cameras, etc. and use these to hold the owner's manuals and receipts.

If you buy tires for your car, place the receipt in your glove box. You will need it in your car if something happens to

car if something happens to your tires.

Scharge receipts:

If you charge items on a credit card, at the time of purchase put the receipt in your billfold. (When I leave the receipt in the bag.) I end up discarding the receipt when I am done with the bag.)

When I get home. I move these receipts to a container like a clear plantic shoe box. When you get your credit card bill, check the bill with the receipts.

If this seems like too much trouble, save the receipts, review your bill and only check the receipts when some-thing looks wrong. When the container gets full, discard the oldest. If your
