## Hills firm develops military guide

The American Institute for Preventative Medicine in Farmington Hills has developed and provided a special Military Self-Care Guide for the U.S. Army.

The guide enables soldiers to make better decisions about what to do for health problems that may be encountered during basic training and military operations.

It is designed to fit in the cargo pouch of a soldier's uniform so that it can be taken into the field for reference.

Some troops have received the Military Self-Care Guide in their deployment bags for assignment overseas.

The guide teaches soldiers to decide which medical symptoms require a visit to the troop medical clinic and

which symptoms can be treated by oneself using self-care.

Some of the health topics addressed include heat rash, earaches, fever, colds and flu, allergies, headaches, insect bites, and cuts.
