"He is one of the most clutch athletes I have ever had the privilege of coaching," Vencos said.

100 freestyle, Jon Thomas, Troy. Thomas to win the 100 freestyle at the Division I state meet at 46.71. He did even better in the state prelims (46.53), which earned him automatic All-American honors.

Thomas also won the 100 freestyle at the Oakland Activities Association Division I meet, posting a time of 48.75. He posted a third place finish (49.00) at the county meet.

Coach Todd Losey said the hardest part of the season for Thomas was adjusting to a new coach and a training philosophy that involved added weight lifting.

"He was hesitant at first because it's my first year as coach and he was used to George O'Brien (who retired)," Losey said. "But he warmed up to it (the change). Our training philosophies are similar and he worked hard."

500 freestyle, Jeff Drews, Troy. Drews excelled at the Division I state finals with a time of 4:47.01 in the prelims. His performance followed a third-place finish in the OAA meet, finishing at 4:57.77.

He also won the 700 free at the league meet with a time of 1:43.63 and finished the county meet with a time of 1:51.00 in that event.

"Jeff is a hard worker at practice, and that's what got him through," Losey said. "Now I want to teach him patience, so he doesn't try to overdo it at first."

200 freestyle relay (Lassar, Armour, Fischer, Brother Rice). The quartet look first at the Division I state finals with an impressive showing of 1:26.71.

"(Armour) could have swam the fly, back or free leg of our medley," Vencos said. "But we wanted to save him for the sprint freestyle relays."

Vencos said his swimmers achieved in the relays while doing well in their individual events.

"We believe the more you focus on relays the more your individual events suffer," Vencos said. "If we go into a meet with our minds on our individual events, our relays will naturally be fast."

100 backstroke, Gabe Schubiner, Cranbrook. Schubiner capped a solid first year with his 54.18 showing in the Division I state finals and an even faster mark in the prelims.

Coach Scott Hedges said Schubiner showed

Particularly gratifying was how Schubiner opened the season "not even breaking 5:30 in the backstroke, and yet came in at 5:05 in the state prelims. Hedges said: "Over the next few years, I think he'll continue to drop time in that event and others."

100 breaststroke, Alex Nienberg, Groves. According to Tenyson, Nienberg entered his senior season determined to win the 100 breaststroke in the Division I state meet.

He did just that. Additional victories were scored at the OAA Division I and county meets.

"His work ethic has improved and his leadership ability has also been tremendous," Tenyson said. "These things can all be seen by our outstanding results."

100 freestyle relay (Lassar, Armour, Fischer, Schoenhals), Brother Rice: Even though the Warriors narrowly missed winning a state title - their 3:40 time was just short of Ann Arbor Pioneer's 3:30.12 - Vencos said his

swimmers delivered a top effort. In particular, he singled out Armour. "He really came through with a lifetime best (by over two seconds) to give us a shot at the championship."
