throughout the meet. "The city meet is always an emotional thing," he said. "There's a rivalry there and everyone wants to do well. We were hoping emotion would carry us a bit, and I think our kids were really up for it."

"It was another exciting meet. It was fun to watch and to be involved in it. It was hard fought, and we had to earn it." Farmington's Bettie Wade was a triple individual winner. She set a school record of 5-6.5 in the high jump, and she also won the 100 and 400 dashes.

Farmington's Becky Willer won the 1,600 and 800 runs, and the Falcons had first runs from Deanna Gauer in the shot put and Ashton Frederick in the long jump.

"She had a great day," Farmington coach Dawn Kukuzick said of Wade. "I didn't expect her to be so low in her times this early. It was late in the season last year when she started getting the same times. She's already there now."

"It was a great meet. Harrison is such a great team. To only lose by five points to them was a great accomplishment." For the Harrison boys, Kevin Davis won both hurdle races, Fermon Tate won the 800 and anchored the winning 3,200 relay. Brian Coats won the 1,600. Brett Laird won the pole vault and high jump. Darius Hoodman won the long jump. Charles Stewart won the 200 and anchored the winning 400 relay and Marcus Woods won the 100.

"The Hawks took the top three places in the 100, top three in the 800 and top two in the 300 hurdles."

"They also were first, second and fourth in the 110 hurdles and pole vault."

"We had a lot of standouts; we had a good meet as a team, so it was a pretty positive day."
