

Malen repeat winner in half marathon

For the second time in two years, Donald Malen was the first runner to reach the finish line at the West Bloomfield Half Marathon.

That's not to say there weren't a few differences. Last year, the weather was cold and windy whereas on Sunday, skies were blue and temps surpassed 60 degrees. The 33-year-old Malen finished the 13.2-mile course in 1:12:30, which was almost a minute quicker than his time in 2002 (1:13:09).

And Malen moved from Birmingham to Troy between the two races.

"The biggest thing that's going to hold you up is wind and cold," said Malen, who personally prefers warmer weather such as Sunday. "Today it was breezy, but not too cold."

Malen said the West Bloomfield race is challenging but enjoyable, as runners can personally see neighborhood spectators who cheer out of their houses to come on the participants - which were down from about 500 to just under 400 (including the Clydesdale division).

"It's such a great course," said Malen, talking about why more didn't come out for the 27th annual half marathon, the oldest in southeastern Michigan. "It's fun. More people ought to be here to do it."

As for finishing nearly 5.5 minutes ahead of runner-up Karl Zubal of Hazel Park (1:17:58), Malen downplayed his achievement. He theorized that "there was a lot of (running) talent in Michigan that didn't show up today. Ann Arbor's half marathon is next month (June) and the winner there will come in at included 1:06 or under 1:10."

Others in the top 10 included Eric Fernando of Franklin, who finished seventh with a time of 1:26:30 and Garden City's John Turkowski, who placed fifth after running the race in 1:24:26. The first woman to cross the finish line - 27th overall - was Barb Clark of Highland, who edged Waterford resident

Kerri Ury by just five seconds, 1:36:12 to 1:36:17. Clark, 39, who recently battled bronchitis and strep throat, panted Ury at about the three-mile mark and maintained her lead the rest of the way.

"I passed her once and darned if she'd pass me again," said Clark, who acknowledged Ury was a tough foe who made things closer than she would have liked.

"I could hear people cheering for her, so that gave me motivation to keep going," Clark said.

Ury, 30, admitted she miscalculated the length of the course, which came to a close just as she thought she had enough room to make one last push.

"I thought it was 13.5 (miles)," Ury said. "I didn't know the finish was right there until I turned the corner (off of Green Road). I had something left, too, I was sprinting at the end."

It was Ury's first race since competing in the 2001 Detroit Free Press Marathon. She just gave birth on Feb. 15 and started training for Sunday shortly thereafter.

"I knew I could finish it, I didn't have any doubts about it," Ury continued. "...I have a real competitive edge."

Both Clark and Ury liked the hilly terrain of the course and that people were outside to watch them run.

"What made it nice is the course, and the people cheering from their homes," said Clark, whose fiancé lives in West Bloomfield. "All the little kids were cheering. That was awesome, and they cheered for everybody it's nice, especially for a half marathon, because it is so long to be out there."

5K RACE WINNERS

The half marathon followed the 5K Run/Walk and Kids Fun Run, which drew 262 and 29 participants, respectively. Winning the 5K Run/Walk was 17-year-old Ben Reed of Okemosville, who wrapped up the course in 17:17. Kimberly Peterson, 34, of Farmington

was the first female finisher, coming in at 19:15. Peterson also came in first in the female age 31-35 bracket.
