

# Rochester golfers win Division I title

With state regional golf action a day away, the Rochester Falcons appear headed for another successful postseason journey.

The Falcons made it two tournament titles in a five-day span, topping a seven-school field Monday at the Oakland Activities Association Division I tournament held at Pine Trace in Rochester Hills. Rochester also won the Eccentric Tournament last Wednesday.

"This would be the time for us to start playing well," said Rochester coach Hal Compton, whose squad has won three of five tournaments this season. "The expectations for us are high and we are starting to put it together."

The Falcons, the defending Division I state champions, had five top-10 finishers in Monday's play-six, score-four league tournament. Rochester totaled 347 strokes to easily outdistance the rest of the field.

Clarkston finished second with 365, while Rochester Adams (391), Bloomfield Hills Laker (411), Farmington Unified (413), Troy Athens (420) and Troy (427) rounded out the team scores.

Rochester sophomore Stephanie Solverson

fired an 81 amid rainy conditions to take medalist honors (the top 10 scores all shot 95 or better) and Clarkston's Anna Trim was one shot back at 82.

The Falcons, who still have two league duals and the second league tournament, which will be next Tuesday at Indianwood Country Club, left to play were simply dominant Monday.

Stacy Goins was third at 83, Angie DePolo tied Troy's Katie O'Donnell in fourth with an 88, Stephanie Squires tied Laker's Megan Carter in sixth with an 92, and Cory Christenson tied Adams' Ashley Thomas in eighth with a 93.

Rochester's Rachel Potts shot a 101, but her score wasn't included in the team scoring. Farmington's Andrea Mazanka shot an 85 which rounded out the top 10 in the medalist standings.

The focus now shifts to regional action which, depending on the region, will be Thursday, Friday or Monday.

Rochester joins Clarkston, Adams, Troy, Athens, Port Huron, Northern, Grose Pointe South and Lake Orion as the top teams at Friday's Slysyan Glen regional, while Farmington will be at Mystic Creek Golf Club today.

CC piled up five runs thanks to a pair of bunts that ignited the rally.

Brooks reached base on a bunt that DeLaSalle misread a chance at a fielder's choice. Todd Tindall followed with what was intended to be a sacrifice bunt, but he turned it into a bunt single that loaded the bases.

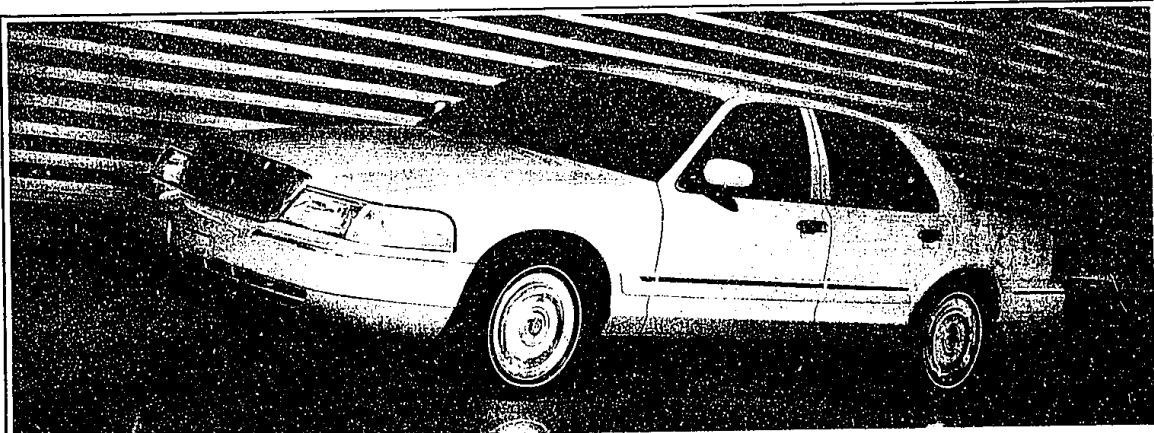
