

Farmington boys runners-up in OAA

Farmington made a run for the top but settled for second place Tuesday in the Oakland Activities Association Division III boys track and field meet.

Royal Oak Kimball won the championship with 126 points at Ferndale High School. Farmington had 109. Danny Preston was the lone individual winner for the Falcons, finishing first in the 400-meter dash (50.9).

The 1,600 relay team of John Kopicko, Chris Clark, Preston and Matt O'Brien also captured first place (3:30.7).

Philip Champion had a pair of second places in the 400 (52.1) and the 200 (22.5). Preston was the runner-up

in the high hurdles (16.1), as was Corrigan in the long jump (19.1).

Farmington's 800 relay team of Joe Green, Champion, Kopicko and Preston came in second, too, with a 1:33 time.

The Falcons recovered from a bad exchange in the 400 to finish third. The team of Eric Gaughan, Corrigan, Green and Glenn Martin was clocked at 46.1.

Champion in the 100 dash (11.2), Sherman Taylor in the discus (121-11) and Gaughan in the long jump (18-8) also finished in third place.

Farmington had a trio of fourths from Green in the 100 (11.3), Drew Martin in the 1,600 (4:52) and Jeff

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Shannon LaFave was fourth in the 1,600 and 3,200 runs.

O'Shiesky was the best in the long jump, 100 dash and both hurdles events.

CC boys finish 2nd

For five straight years, Redford Catholic Central's track teams were the cream of the Catholic League's A-B Division.

For the past two years, however, the Shamrocks have had to settle for the runner-up spot to University of Detroit-Jesuit. Brother Rice was third. The Cubs won the final event - the 1,600 relay - and clinched the title with a 146-139 win over the Shamrocks, who came in third in the race.

"By far, this is the best league performance we've had in a while as far as the kids coming through," CC coach Tony Magni said. "Unfortunately for us,

it came down to the 1,600 and they won."

The Shamrocks won the 400 relay with Ed Moore, Dan Moore, Mike Palombo and Rob Lawrence (45.93).

Zach Zull took the long jump at 18-10.5, while Scott Budawski was fourth (17-9 3/4) and Jose Cosme was fifth (17-9 1/2).

What helped CC the most was the throwing. Sophomore Jon Smart won the shot put at 47-2, while Pat Clark was third (46-3 1/2) and John Mulroy was fourth (45-6).

Nick Barrett led a 2-3-4-5 showing in the discus at 133-3, followed by Ryan Danescu (129-0), Andrius Giedraitis (124-8) and Clark (116-11).

"Zull was a bonus and so was the 400 relay," Magni said. "(Smart) winning the shot was a great achievement, because he started the year as the seventh or eighth man. He just kept coming and coming."

"Our throws were fantastic. We've won the shot 10 of the last 11 years under (coach) Gene Grewe. We're really happy with our kids."

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lined with the intermediate hurdles. Brown also was third in the latter (49.95).

The Hawks had another individual first by Laura Glynn, who won the 400 dash for the second year in a row with a 1:00.64 time.

"She's had a terrific season," Babcock said. "It was another one of those great performances on her part."

Harrison's Krystal Wise and Jessie Drew combined with Donoho-Adams and Vinas to win the 400 relay (51.09) and Brown and Glynn for first place in the 800 relay (1:50.90).

The Hawks also qualified in the 1,600 relay with a second-place finish by Emmonne Green, Glynn, Drew and Vinas.

Other Harrison qualifiers included Tarrin Dew in the discus (99-10.5), Wise in the 100 dash (12-44) and Shannon Bailey in the 3,200 run (12:17.36).

Also scoring points for the Hawks were Brown in the high

jump, fourth, 4-9; Dew, shot put, fourth, 31-1.5; Tanya Hficks, shot put, sixth, 30-1; and Wise, 200 dash, fourth, 26.83.

The 3,200 relay team of Bailey, Green, Trina Maslenkova and Glynn finished in fourth place (10:39.8).

"I certainly would consider it one of our best performances of the season, and it's the right time of year to do it," Babcock said.

"This (regional victory) may be the most surprising. I thought we would hang in there and stay with Algonac, and our girls really ran well. We were quite pleased."

Hawks roll in boys meet

The Harrison boys qualified all four relays for the state meet and won three of those races at the Marysville regional.

The Hawks were first in the 3,200 (8:22.3), 800 (1:51.39) and 400 relays (43:41).

The 1,600 team was second (5:30.8).

Kevin Davis was a standout in the hurdles, winning the 300-meter intermediates (2:05.83) and taking third in the 110 highs (14.48). He qualified

in both events.

Marcus Woods had Harrison's only other region win, sprinting to first place in the 100 dash (10.78).

Qualifying for state with second-place finishes were Brett Laird in the pole vault (12-3), Charles Pickett, 100 dash (10.94); Fernon Tate, 400 dash (50.33); Brian Coats, 800 run (1:59.39); and Charles Stewart, 200 dash (22.84).

Stewart was just three hundredths of a second out of first place in the 200, which was won by Redford Thurston's Edward Brown in 22.81.

The Hawks did well in the pole vault with Terrance Gmbinski getting fourth (11-3) and Remy Sulaiman fifth (11-3).

Darius Goodman scored in two events, taking sixth in the long jump (19-2.5) and sixth in the 400 dash (54.18).

Laird also was fifth in the high jump (5-9), James Cook fourth in the 400 (53.35), Andrew MacLean sixth in the 300 hurdles (43.1), Charles Gies fourth in the 800 (2:05.83) and Robert McCall third in the 200 (23.21).

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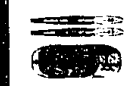
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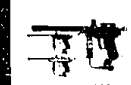
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
