

Blazers win with overtime goal

Livonia Ladywood repeated as Division II district girls soccer champion Saturday — and it didn't come without some anxious moments.

Sandy Swish scored the game-winning goal with 6:32 left in the second overtime to give the Blazers a sudden-death triumph over Dexter.

Ladywood improved to 8-5-5 overall with the victory, while Dexter bowed out of 8-8-3.

Kelsey Patti gave the visiting Drednoughts a 1-0 lead by scoring a goal with 19:12 left in the first half.

Ladywood's Patti Hoeg scored just 54 seconds into the second half on an assist from Lauren Hess.

The game remained that way through 80 minutes of regulation play thanks to a late second-half breakaway stop by Ladywood goalkeeper Stefani Szczeczkowski.

"Stefani was not ready to go home," Ladywood coach Jill Lygdon said. "We came out kind of slow and Dexter was ready to go, but she came on and ended up outlasting them 14-7."

On the game-winning goal, Lindsay Rowe gained possession at midfield, moved 10 yards down the sideline and sent a cross to Swish, who one-touched the ball and bent the Dexter defender one-on-one before finishing a shot from 20 yards out to the near-post, upper corner.

alone (well ahead of the other teams), and we ran fast enough to make all-state. It was hard to do, but they did a good job."

Harrison needed a come-from-behind effort midway in the meet to overtake Stevensville, which had a 41-14 lead over the Hawks at one point.

Davis and Tate, both of whom were individual state champions, were instrumental in the Harrison comeback.

The Hawks began their rally with Marcus Woods, Charles Pickett, Rob McCall and Charles Stewart winning the 400 relay (42.94).

"Then, Tate and Davis had back-to-back victories — Tate in the 400 dash (49.18) and Davis in the 300 intermediate hurdles (38.64) — to put Harrison on top, 44-41."

The Hawks were assured of winning the championship since Stevensville was the only team entered in any of the last three events and couldn't score any more points.

Davis also was tied for seventh in the high hurdles with Battle Creek Harper Creek's Kyle Sacksteder, each with a 16:10 time.

des represented a turnaround from last year when he was sick on the day of the state finals and failed to score in either hurdles event.

"That was the fulfillment of a lifelong dream," Reed said. "That's something he had been shooting for ever since he was a freshman."

"He was really able to come back big his senior year. It was a nice way to finish."

Tate, who was sick the day of the regional and finished second, qualified for the fastest heat as the No. 7 runner and was assigned to lane one.

"That's a difficult lane to run in," Reed said. "But we knew he could run that fast and he was spectacular; he really came on."

"We knew he could run much faster than he did at the regional. It was a nice day for him, too."

Tate and Davis have been invited to represent Michigan and compete in the Midwest Meet of Champions next week in Ohio.

Tate had the fastest 400 time of any runner in the state Saturday, and Davis dropped 1.5 seconds from his previous best time in the 300 hurdles.

Tate also anchored a seventh-place finish in the 3,200 relay. Charlie Gass, Andrew Singer, Brian Coats and Tate ran a time of 8:04.41, also from the slow heat.

Woods placed fourth in the 100 dash (11.09) and combined again with Pickett, McCall and Stewart for third place in the 800 relay (1:40.64).

"Marcus provided a ton of leadership, keeping the guys focused," Reed said. "He was our team leader."

"He got us out to great starts in both relays, and that made all the difference in being all-state."

Another state championship was the culmination of a season of hard work and dedication by a lot of athletes, Reed added.

"We didn't have to win a state championship, but I wanted them to feel like they closed it out with something they could be proud of and happy with," he said.

"It's hard to keep kids going this time of year, to maintain their focus. It's an indication of the kind of kids we have here. We have great kids."

GIRLS STATE RESULTS: In the Division II girls meet at Caledonia, Harrison Junior Kristal Wise placed sixth in the 100 dash (12.83).

The Hawks were one of eight teams tied with three points apiece. Detroit Renaissance was the state title with 67 in the Division II girls meet at Houseman Field in Grand Rapids. Mercy senior Alexandra Marshall was fifth in the 400 dash (55.77), Farmington sophomore Katie Wade fifth in the high jump (5-5) and North Farmington senior Susan Barrows seventh in the 2,000 run (11:59).

Based on those finishes, Mercy and Farmington had four team-points each, North two.

Harrison's Laura Glynn set a school record in the 400 dash (59.8) and finished in ninth place. She missed a scoring position and received a medal by two-tenths of a second.

BOYS STATE RESULTS: The Farmington boys didn't score in the Division I state meet but still ran pretty well, according to coach Chip Bridges.

The 400 relay team won its heat, was 17th overall and ran its best time of the season (43.93) using an electronic time-keeping system.

Philip Champion ran 50.4 in the 400 dash and finished 12th. He had his best time of the season.

"It was a pretty incredible performance for a freshman," Bridges said. "Freshmen rarely qualify in sprint events for the boys. To qualify in the 400 and run well is a very nice job. He also ran on the 400 relay."

"I was pleased with our effort and the fact we ran two PRs and got some much needed experience."

"Other than Danny Preston, all the guys we took were underclassmen. Hopefully, it will whet their appetite for next year."

North Farmington didn't score in the Division II boys meet either.
