Being a Good Listener

Listening to others is more than just hearing what they say, and certainly more than just the sound of their voices striking our eardrums. When we truly listen to others, we are making a commitment to them. We are saying that we care enough about them to listen mindfully to what they have to say. Once we have made that commitment to listen mindfully, we should follow two important rules: First, we should be committed to accepting the other person and caring about them unconditionally. Second, we should be committed to listening to them non-judgmentally. People rarely ask for or appreciate our critical judgments about them. On the contrary, when a person feels like they have an attentive listener who cares about them and will listen non-judgmentally, they usually open up and communicate very effectively. Perhaps that is why Jesus always seemed to have people around him, because He loved unconditionally and refrained from judging others.
