Former Pasta Stop owner Roger Ratkowski has a beef with the City of Farmington. Officials have denied four special cruise nights that would begin in Farmington and end in Livonia – June 18, July 9, Aug. 13 and Sept. 10

"I was disappointed that I was not informed that I was on the agenda so I could answer any of your concerns and I am deeply disappointed in your motion to deny any further support for this event, Ratkowski wrote city manager Vince Pastue in a June 16 leiter.

ter. Pastue said Ratkowski knew the city wasn't supportive of the special events, even before the official council meeting. "I had a conversation with him ahead of time and I

expressed my reluctance," said Pastue. He couldn't remember whether he provided Ratkowski with the meeting date.

In the future, Pastue hopes any event requests will first go through the Downtown Development Authority. Last year, the special cruise drew 188 classic cars and there's just not enough room to stage all of them before the cruise starts, Goss said. He doesn't know why Rakowski wasn't informed about the agenda the Aramington City Hall, he said.
