Deal Jane: Post-partum blues occur frequently as a result of normal bormonal changes that of the post your daily overall nucedoning you may be experiencing a more severe form - called post-

The symptoms may include but are not limited to anxiety, depression, obsessive thinking, depression, obsessive thinking, agitation, irritability, insomnia, lack of motivation, frequent crying, fear of carring for the buby as well as thoughts of harming yourself or your baby. Mental health treatment, romethings comblined treatment, sometimes combined with medication, is very successful in treating post-partum depression.

your life. Many women go through a grieving process over these losses and experience some feelings of resentment.
