Area decathlete takes 3rd in USA meet

The U.S. is trying to make resurgence in the men's decathlon and Livonia native Paul Terek apparently doesn't want to miss out on the all the

In a meet where Ton Pappas established himself as the No. 2 decathlete in American history and a threat to become No. 1 in the world, Terek also made a name for himself June 1-22 at the USA Track and Field Championships held in Palo Alto. Callf., when he took third with a personal best 8,275 points, beating his previous mark by 234 points. Terek also earned a trip to the World Championships in Paris, scheduled for late August. n. Pappas, meanwhilt, broke Dan O'Brien's championskip record and leaped to No. 2 on the all-time U.S. list with 8,784 points, crushing his personal best of 8,685. Pappas also rassed Bruse Jenuer (8,634). passed Bruce Jenner (8,634), Steve Fritz (8,644), Chris Huffins (8,694) and Dave Johnson (8,727) as the top

The 1,000 basically was to just finish the race and get a good score.
