CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS 2003 SUMMER TAX BILLS PUBLIC NOTICE
 The City of Farmington Hills 2003 Summer Tax Bills will be mailed on or about June 30. They are payable from July 1, 2003 through September 2, 2003 without penalty. A 4% penalty will be added starting September 3, along with a one-half percent per month interest charge. By law, failure to receive a tax bill does not waive tax or penalty. If you do not receive your bill by July 16, please contact the Treasurer's Office at (248) 871-2480.
 The Treasurer's Office will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, except for July 4, to accept payment. Payment may also be made at branches of Standard Federal Bank and Metrobank located within the cities of Farmington Hills or Farmington. Payments made at these banks may be subject to an account relationship requirement and/or a processing fee.
 A drop slot is available near the Eleven Mile Road entrance to City Hall along with a drive up drop box on the traffic island between City Hall and the Police Station.
 Applications for delinquent of 2003 summer taxes are available at the Treasurer's Office. If your income did not exceed \$25,000 and you are a paraplegic, quadriplegic, senior citizen, eligible serviceman, eligible widow, blind or totally or permanently disabled, your application for delinquent must be filed with the Treasurer's Office no later than September 14, 2003. Deferred summer taxes may be paid without penalty until February 14, 2004.

CITY OF FARMINGTON SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE REGARDING MASSAGE FACILITIES
 Public Notice is hereby given that, at its June 16, 2003, Regular Meeting, the City Council of the City of Farmington adopted Ordinance No. O-05-2003, summarized below. The purpose of this Ordinance is to revise certain terminology, to provide additional regulations, and to clarify procedures under the existing Massage Parlors Ordinance. Specifically, the amended Ordinance changes the term "massage parlors" to "massage facilities," limits the exemption from licensing requirements for beauty parlors and similar uses; updates the regulations governing operation of a facility; and clarifies the licensing and license renewal process.
 A full copy of the Massage Facilities Ordinance, as amended, is on file in the City Clerk's Office for public review and inspection.
