### CIVIL WAR VETERAN IS DEAD AT THE AGE OF 84

Abram V. Smith, Civil War veteran, died at the home of his granddaughter, Mrs. Agnes Welsh of 644 Hollywood avenue, Detroit, on Tuesday of heart trouble. He was confined to his bed only a few days before his death.

Mr. Smith, had he lived, would have been 84 years of age in May, being born in Bowling Green, O., May 19, 1845. He enlisted in Grand Army of the Republic at the age of 17, was captured by the Confederate Army and sent to Libby Prison. When he came out of there at the close of the war he was "only skin and bones" weighing, as he put it, "76 pounds with a new suit on."

Mr. and Mrs. Smith spent a number of years in Walled Lake, making their home with Mr. and Mrs. F. S. Schmidt.

A penalty of not more than \$10,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, and in addition, 25 per cent of the amount of the tax, is imposed by the statute for wilful failure to make return on time.
