ROUTE OF THE NEW M-53 PAVING IS DISCUSSED

The question of the route of the State Road M-56, through Walled Lake is arousing considerable discussion. Residents on the east side of the Lake want it there, while those on the west side want it on their side. The paving of this road has been put on the 1931 program but this means very little. By that time an entirely new administration may be in power and the program laid out by the present road commission may not be carried out.

In view of the paving being delayed until 1931, the Exchange Club at their meeting last week appointed a committee to interview the County Road Commission regarding the filling in the gap of four miles from Novi to the Maple road under the act which enables the commission to fill in gaps of four miles or less. A bill presented by Rep. P. J. Miller is before the State House of Representatives, now regarding the four-mile stretch. The bill provides for the county at large to pay for the buildings of these short stretches of concrete.

The club also voted to send a committee to Lansing to interview Governor Green and the State Road Commissioner, but the committee has not been appointed, awaiting report from the County.

REAL ESTATE BOOMS AT WALLED LAKE VILLAGE

Real estate began to boom at Walled Lake last week. Bachelor Brothers have sold their four lots with 120-foot frontage on the road and on the Lake next to the Cazenova Shores property to Herman Czenkusch. The price is believed to be in the neighborhood of \$30,000. Mr. Czenkusch, it is understood will turn this piece along with the rest of the property over to F. W. Pearce of Detroit who will occupy the property with a roller coaster and other amusement enterprises.

Dr. E. F. Holcomb of Farmington has sold his cottage on the south shore of the lake to Herman Czenkusch, but Dr. Holcomb did not divulge the price.

It is reported Bachelor Brothers have purchased the George O. Groll property at the corner of the Lake Shore drive and Fourteen-Mile road.

Fred Bushey has taken an option on a lot at the corner of the Novi and Thirteen-Mile road.

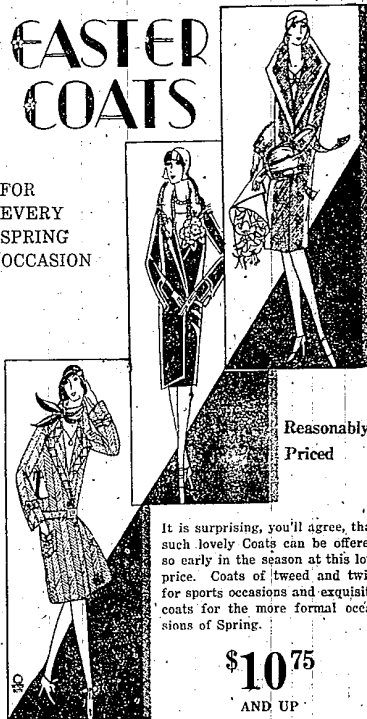
