There are two types of fiction in most libraries including that of the Farmington schools. Two books of the first type, "Daddy Long Legs" and "The Prince and the Pauper" by Mark Twain are very interesting.

The story of the former is told in letters written by a benefactor who is sending her to college. The only thing connected with him which she has ever seen is his shadow which gave her an impression of long legs. Hence the nickname "Daddy Long Legs."

"The Prince and the Pauper" is the story of two little boys, a prince and a pauper, who look alike. By a series of events the pauper becomes the prince and the prince the pauper, but after many exciting adventures the prince finally comes back and the pauper becomes the king's ward.

Books of the latter type are "Vanity Fair" by Thackeray and "David Copperfield" by Dickens. "Vanity Fair" deals mainly with "Amelia Sedley" and "Betsy Sharp," telling of their lives from the time they leave school. Although Betsy is a villainess, she is much more interesting than Amelia, who is too colorless like a great many people in real life. George Osborne, Amelia's husband, and her husband, are also very true to life.

"David Copperfield" tells the story of that character's life from the time he is born until he is about thirty.
