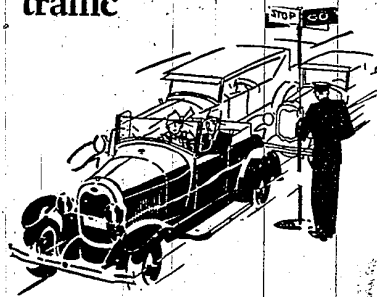

**HEAT CAUSES RECORD
TRAFFIC FOR WEEK-END**

With terrific heat driving thousands of Detroiters out into the country, traffic on Grand River avenue last week end reached a volume that has probably never been exceeded.

The "bottle-neck" between the Eight Mile road and Farmington was the scene of almost continual congestion. Practically all of Sunday, cars coming westward were lined up four abreast for as far as a mile back, while County officers ordered a few ahead at a time, first from one line and then another.

An unusual spectacle Saturday night late was the hundreds of cars bunched toward Detroit at a late hour. Most of the traffic at this time is westbound, Detroiters headed for the country for the week end. Saturday night, however, thousands of them had apparently gone out for a few hours' relief from the heat and were returning only after the heat had subsided.
