NEW CATHOLIC CHURCH DEDICATION HELD IN WALLED LAKE VILLAGE

In a brief and impressive ceremony the new Catholic Church at Walled Lake, St. Williams chapel, was dedicated Sunday afternoon. Bishop Joseph C. Plagens officiated, a group of the church men, headed by the Catholic Boys Band of Detroit, marching to Maple and Pontiac roads to greet the Bishop and escorting him into the new church.

Following prayers and songs by the Holy Redeemer choir of Detroit, Bishop Plagens gave a ten-minute talk. He referred to "the crowds of Merry-makers" and with the thought that in their play they should think of God. He commended Rev. Jos. G. Schuler, pastor of the church and the people of the church for their good work in building the structure, "started by the noble donation of Wm. O'Flaherty." In his talk he referred to the work of the church and quoted from St. James "Faith without works is dead."

Bishop Plagens wore a white cape, as did his deacon, Rev. Dolan of Milford and the sub-deacon. The other priests were dressed in black, among whom

was noted, Rev. Klarkowski of Walled Lake, Rev. Callahan of Farmington, Rev. Lefevre of Plymouth, Rev. Cook of Redford, Rev. Orlick of Orchard Lake and Rev. Thornton of Pontiac as well as several from Detroit and a few from out of the State.

Mass will be held each Sunday morning at the church at 11:30 a. m. The church committee is John DeConick, Wm. O'Flaherty, Joseph A. Payne, Philip Pokrieka, and Thomas Dugan.
Dinner was served following the dedication at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Payne for the visiting clergy.

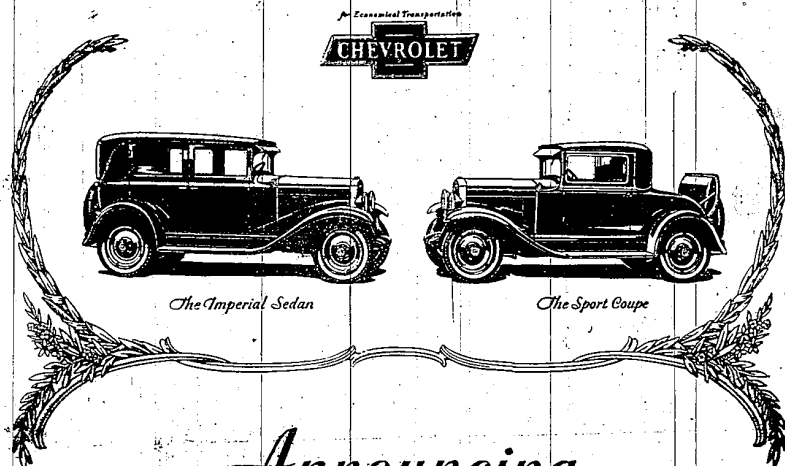
