Members of the Club accompanied the children, who were to have a full day of fun, with rides, refreshments, and games.

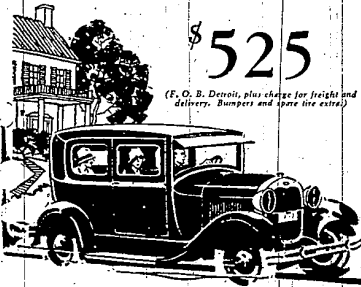
**CITY OFFICIALS ARE
