CHEVROLET PRODUCES A MILLION SIX-CYLINDER CARS IN EIGHT MONTHS

One million six-cylinder Chevrolets have been placed on the road since the first of the year. This sensational announcement, indicating as it does the great popular appeal of the new six-cylinder car, was made at the central offices of the company as assembly plants in various parts of the country were operating on the biggest summer production schedule in the history of Chevrolet.

Never in the history of the industry has any other manufacturer equalled the achievement of placing a million six-cylinder cars on the road in less than 8 months. In fact, according to observers, this is more than three times as many six-cylinder cars as were ever produced by a manufacturer during a like period.

The record-making model, probably the most famous of all Chevrolet record cars, rolled off the assembly line at the huge Flint, Mich., plant on August 5. It happened on the day when the new Imperial sedan, introduced a few weeks ago. The glistering record-breaker was welcomed at the end of the assembly line by W. S. Knudsen, president, and other high Chevrolet officials.

Without any ceremony the car left the plant for Detroit where it will be presented as one of the interesting exhibits that are to be a part of the mammoth Chevrolet sales convention in Detroit, August 14-15-16.

Nearly every state in the Union had a share in the building of the million sixes. Pennsylvania, Ohio and Michigan furnished the steel; the South and the West supplied the wood; the South and the Northeast provided the cotton and wool; the rubber came from Ohio, Illinois and California; the glass from Pennsylvania, Ohio and Illinois and the Duco and enamel from New Jersey and Michigan.

Chevrolet has used all previous precedents in the low priced field by causing the production of six-cylinder cars to exceed the production of four-cylinder cars for the first time in automotive history.

FREE AIRPLANE RIDES AT EDGEWATER PARK

Edgewater Park, Detroit's big amusement center on the Seven-Mile road, west, near Grand River, will be host each Sunday afternoon during the park season to a woman for a ride in an airplane. She will be chosen from the audience and will accompany Eddie Baker who will leap from the plane when a mile above earth. The daring parachute jumper will further thrill his audience by not opening his parachute un-

til he has fallen 1,000 feet. The big plane then will circle over the west end with its passenger. In preparation for the huge crowds anticipated Tuesday night, August 27, when a Ford automobile is given away, the park management has provided free parking space for 6,000 automobiles. This will be the third automobile given away at the park this season.

Also during the amusement park season, there will be a free fireworks display each Wednesday night at 9:30 o'clock.

Edgewater Park compares with the greatest amusement parks in this country, one of the big attractions being the mile-long thriller, while among this year's newest amusement devices are the "tipy house," the "bug," a dozen games and rides of every kind.

In the beautiful open air ballroom that overlooks the lagoon, Jean Goldkette has his famous Casa Loma orchestra. This dance floor is considered one of the most perfect in Detroit and the ballroom is so arranged that the breezes sweep it from the River Rouge and yet it is protected from inclement weather. The scheme of decorations in the Edgewater ballroom is one of the most novel and magnificent of any ballroom in the country.

GROWS SPARTAN BARLEY

One of the most interesting crops of grain grown in Oakland County this year, was the crop of Spartan Barley recently harvested by Wm. Crawford of Milford, according to Harold M. Vaughn, County Agricultural Agent.

The Spartan Barley is a new variety which has just been leased for general planting during 1929. It was originated at Michigan State College and thoroughly tested by the Michigan Crop Improvement Association. The variety has proved to be a very high yielding and disease resistant strain of two row barley. It has the additional advantage of being smooth awned.

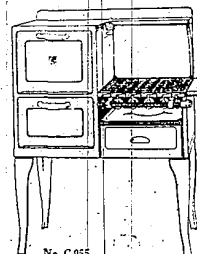
