Trees cut down, shade trees topped off, limbs and branches taken from Windows, Hedges and trees shaped up, lots cleared, etc.

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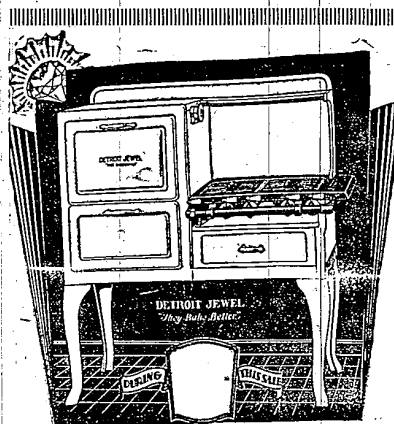
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
