

Everything is in readiness for the American Legion Fourth of July celebration that will take place at the fair grounds in Northville next Friday. On Saturday afternoon there will be a complete program of both trotting and pacing races.

FISHING SEASON OPENS

The fishing season opens at the lakes in this section on Wednesday, June 25. Fishing has been permitted in certain lakes designated as pike lakes since May 1.

This year black bass, both large and small mouth, must be ten inches long and only five a day and five in possession at one time is permitted. Five pike may be taken in one day or be in possession, but they must exceed 14 inches in length. Bluegills, sunfish and perch limit is set at 25.
