The petition method of nomin-ating candidates for the board of education was adopted Monday night by the electors of Farm-ington School District. No. 5, and is expected to be put in operation for the election next year.

The petitions must be signed by fifty qualified school electors of the District.

Arthur Lamb and A. L. Ross, elected Monday night by the voters of Farmington School Dis-trict No. 5, are to quality Friday for their terms by filing the nec-essary oaths of office with the secretary of the Board of Educa-tion
