#### CITY COMMISSION ORDER'S WHEELER BANNER DOWN

On Monday evening the City Commission, as result of protests by county road officials, voted to order the banner down. It was removed Tuesday morning by city employes.

Commissioner A mos O t is brought the matter before the governing body, saying that county road officials would like to see the bannier taken down, and that he believed it would be good policy to accede to their wishes. He offered a motion that the banner be taken down, Commissioner Hatton supporting the motion.

At this point the Commission was informed that the Edison company had ordered the banner removed from their pole on the south side, but it was also pointed out that those who put up the banner might attach it to a nearby building. The Commission then voted without dissent to order the streamer removed.

The American Legion's Gala Day banner was also ordered removed from the Edison pole, it is understood, but will be attached to the Lee Building instead.
