Rules For The Next War Why They Advertise

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS
Regular meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington, held April 20, 1931.
Called to order by Mayor Lamb at 7:35 p. m. Commissioners present: Stamann, Gildemeister, Osmus, Hatton, Hamlin and Goers. Minutes of the meeting of April 6, 9 and 13 read and approved.
Moved by Hatton, seconded by Hamlin that the volunteer firemen's insurance policy in the Traveler's Insurance Co. be renewed. Carried.

Thomas Armstrong furnished a constable's bond to the Commission for \$1,000 signed by John J. Schulte.
Mrs. Irish addressed the Commission in regard to the City Park and asked that the log cabin be removed. Mrs. Martha Warner supported the request and also asked the Commission to devise a way to clean up the old Cogs-dill property on Grand River avenue west. Referred to the Park Committee.
Commissioner Osmus asked that the surplus dirt that comes from paving Grand River avenue be placed on North Power avenue, and that the Clerk be instructed to write Pygath & Son, road contractors, to that effect. So ordered by the Commission.
Commissioner Stamann reported that a 500-gallon oil tank can be purchased for \$20.00. No action taken.
Commissioner Hatton told the Commission that it would be proper and feasible to lay a new water main from Maple avenue to Power avenue and from Grove street to the lumber yard at the present time before the new pavement is laid. Referred to the Water Committee.

Motion made by Osmus, seconded by Hamlin that the request of City Treasurer Nichols for a surety bond of \$5,000 be granted. Carried.
Mr. Kennedy spoke to the Commission in regard to the Adams road machine, as did Mr. Lundberg for the caterpillar tractor. Street committee will make a report on the matter.
Mr. Hamlin of Plymouth spoke at length on the practicability and importance of assessors plans for the city. No action taken.
