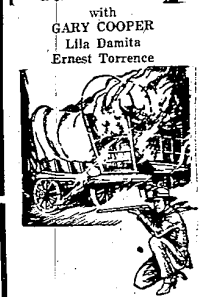


M. E. Quarterly Conference

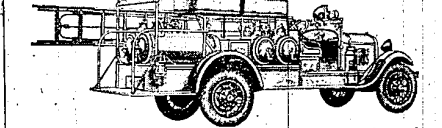
bus fares.
About three months ago, the City Commission discussed attaching part of the company's rails to secure the taxes. Assurance was given, however, that the tax would be paid, and there was no attempt to prevent taking up the tracks.
"Can Collect"
Farmington Township officials consulted the County Prosecutor on the situation, and on his advice refrained from drastic action. It is understood that the Prosecutor advised the Township officials that should the taxes remain unpaid, there would undoubtedly be means of collecting even though the rails and overhead equipment were taken away.
Oxford Township seized the company's property, and Oxford village took six gravel cars. The Royal Oak and Ferndale treasurers plan to sell the equipment to satisfy the tax bills, unless the company pays within a short time.

Brother Of Olin Russell Is Honored By U. Of M.

University of Michigan has honored Dr. Nelson Russell, brother of Olin Russell of Farmington, who has been awarded a Lloyd traveling fellowship for 1931-32, and has been given leave of absence from Coe college. Cedar Rapids, where he is head of the history department, and will leave in August for Europe where he will study in England and France. He expects to do research work in the British Museum, the public record office and in the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris. Two of these fellowships are granted each year. After receiving the Ph. D. degree in 1925 from the University of Michigan, he taught there for some time, later spending four years in the history department of the University of California, Los Angeles, just previous to the two years he has been at Coe college.

LIGHTS IMPROVE

Within the past two months the number of automobiles being operated with improper lighting equipment on roads and highways of this state has decreased 50 per cent, according to figures gathered this week by the Detroit Automobile Club.

In February, a state-wide test by the Club showed that 22 per cent of the cars throughout the state were operated without headlights, with only one headlight, or with no tail light. The recent state-wide check-up showed that this defectiveness had been decreased to 12 per cent. In addition, the survey showed that whereas ten per cent of all cars previously had glaring headlights this number has now been reduced to three per cent.

MICHIGAN STATE PARKS WILL OPEN MAY 15

Lansing. — Michigan's state parks will open officially May 15, two weeks earlier than in former years, it was announced today by the Parks Division of the Conservation Department.

Decision to open the parks earlier this season came as a result of the advanced spring and the large number of people who have already visited the parks.

It is possible that some of the parks will not be re-opened this year, but no definite decision has been made.
