TRITONS COMMIT 17 ERRORS; LOSE AT WALLED LAKE

Farmington H. S. Baseball Team
Probably Sets New Record
For Misplays

Farmington High School baseball team probably set a new record Tuesday afternoon, but one which they do not care to achieve again in a game featured by 25 errors. Walled Lake High School defeated Farmington, 18 to 7 at Walled Lake. The winners earned but one run, the Tritons committing 17 errors behind Ivan Cox and Harold Westfall, who hurled for the losers. Walled Lake made 8 misplays.

Cox started on the mound for Farmington but left the game in the fourth inning after eight runs had been scored in that stanza. In the previous inning Walled Lake crossed the plate 7 times. Westfall relieved Cox and checked the attack.

Lester Pennell opened for Walled Lake, but was driven from the mound, Farmington hitting safely seven times and tallying four times in the two innings he hurled. Jack Champe replaced him, and restricted his opponents to one hit in five innings.

Seven runs in the third and eight more in the fourth put the game on ice for Walled Lake. In the second inning, Eno, Walled Lake catcher reached first on an error and made the circuit on three more errors. In the third inning when Walled Lake scored seven runs, Farmington committed eight "boots" and the following inning three more errors added to make eight in all.

Walled Lake garnered 13 hits, and Farmington hit safely 7 times.
