voted to have 10 months of school, as in the past. Another motion declaring for "full-day sessions, necessary rooms for teachers, and sufficient teachers hired," was carried. To the protests that the expense was too great and that the Board had already decided on half-day sessions, it was answered that "nothing is too good for the children."

Meet July 27

The final motion was for a special meeting within two weeks to vote on whether the District should build a temporary school. All of the motions were made by A. Ray Oldham, and with the exception of the first motion, for ten months of school, support was by Charles Wierschin. Mr. Oldham was secretary and Mr. Wierschin was a trustee of the Board when the five members resigned in November, 1929, after defeat of the bond issue.

Election of officers followed passage of the various motions. Mr. Wierschin nominated Fred Wilkinson, who was elected to the board two and a half-years ago, after the five resignations. S. Brooks supported the nomination. Mrs. Helen Gregor nominated herself. Of the 65 votes cast, Mr. Wilkinson received 43 and Mrs. Gregor 17.

William McCullough, treasurer of the board, was nominated for re-election. Mr. McCullough was one of those elected in the fall of 1929, at the same time as Mr. Wilkinson. Carl Smith was also nominated and of the 66 votes cast, Mr. Smith received 47 and Mr. McCullough 19.

Miss Martha Noble, secretary of the board, has issued official notice of the meeting July 27 to vote on the temporary school.

The Detroit Amateur Federation rules call for a game between the two leading teams in the City's best semi-pro league. West Point Park and Skrzycki were tied for second place until their play-off game Thursday afternoon. Herman Lau, holder of first place, will oppose West Point Park Sunday.
