## Annual School Report

Proceedings of Annual Meeting—Clarenceville Schools, July 13th, 1931, 8 P. M.

Meeting called, to order by the President, Mr. Headlee. All members of the board present, and about 61 voters. Minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved. Report of 1930-1931 read and all voters received a mimeographed copy.

Election of trustees, one to be elected. Tellers, Mr. Humphrey and Mrs. Billings.

Mr. Headlee nominated by Mr. Earl, nomination supported by Mr. Heise.

Mr. Wagner nominated Mr. Hinborn, nomination supported by Mr. Barber.

Motion made by Mrs. Menke, supported by Mrs. Billings, that nominations be closed.

Total ballots cast, 61; Headlee, 39; Hinborn, 22. Mr. Headlee declared elected. Motion carried.

Officers' salaries: Motion by Mr. Heck, supported by Mrs. Billings, that salaries remain the same.

Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Earl, supported by Mr. Humphrey, that the length of the school year should be left to the Board of Education to determine. Motion carried.

Motion by Mrs. Billings, supported by Mrs. Meyers, that text books be furnished free. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Utujan, supported by Mrs. Doherty, that we pay excess tuition to the extent of the sum asked by the Farmington high school. Motion carried.

Motion by Mrs. Billings, supported by Mr. Laforge, that depository be left to the Board. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Heise, supported by Mr. Gaylord, that 8 o'clock p. m. will be the time set for the next annual meeting. Motion carried.

Motion by Mrs. Billings, supported by Earl, that meeting adjourn.
