My Neighbor

Says:

KEEP the copper coils in a gas burner clean by using a brush or cloth once a week. Soot acts as an insulator and considerably less gas is required to get hot water when the coils are clean.

To broil cod, haddock, bluefish or mackerel, split down the back and broil whole, after first removing head, Salmon and swordfish cut into small slices for broiling. Smells and other small fish are broiled whole without splitting.

When making a fruit tart mix a little cornstarch with the sugar before adding it. This will make the juice thick and prevent its boiling over.

In a custard recipe calling for several eggs, one or more may be left out if one-half tablespoonful of cornstarch is added for each egg omitted.
