Shaw's Career One Man Show

George Bernard Shaw -- young socialist, a genius at his peak, while bearded patriarch -- will be seen in "By George" at the University of Detroit Student Union Ballroom at 8:30 p.m., Friday, Dec. 6.

Max Adrian brings Shaw to the U. of D. Town and Gown series in this one-man show. Adrian, a fine British actor, who like Shaw, is a native Irishman, portraying the famous playwright and critic at three stages of his adult career; in each he is uncannily believable.

Then, in 1892, "Widower's House," his first play is produced. It is not a hit, but a jubilant Shaw says he knows he is a "born genius."

IN "THE ARRIVAL" Adrian's Shaw is a genius at his peak, writing his greatest plays, falling in and out of love and picking his friends carefully, while recalling an Oscar Wilde line, "An excellent man, Shaw has no enemies and none of his friends like him."

"The Eminence" is the final

part of "By George" and brings a white-bearded patriarch, sounding off with a straight face on "the apostolic succession of the drama, from Aeschylus to himself" and, in the last fading light, leaving clues that he is finding his way back to God.

There is, for example, the letter he wrote the Abbess of Worcesterhouse: "Shelley was the man who called me to the religious life at 18. . . that I have only written about. . . God must be sick of this fellow Shaw."

THE PROGRAM, arranged by Michael Voysey from Slavian letters, critiques and interviews, then tied by selected biographical facts, comes to Detroit by way of the 1966 Edinburgh Festival, a later triumphant London engagement and a successful Broadway run in the fall of 1967.

Adrian manages to look remarkably like Shaw, although the likeness is much more a triumph of make-up and a projection of the master's mannerisms than any natural resemblance.

He begins with "The Search," as a vibrant, jaunty and red-whiskered Socialist, certain through the 1880's of his own brilliant while wondering why others are slow in catching on. As a showman newspaper critic, he sways no favorites, blasting both Patti and Irving for

Meadow Brook Makes Change In Spring Playbill

Shakespeare's "Troilus and Cressida" has been selected to replace "Hamlet" as the sixth play of the Meadow Brook Theatre's 1968-69 season.

The hitting change was made because of two productions of "Hamlet" opened this fall in Detroit, according to Meadow Brook Director John Fernald.

Fernald said, "Troilus and Cressida" has had few professional productions in this country because of the difficulty in staging it and I look forward to the challenge. This will be the first time I have ever directed it.

fulfillment without honor" and its effect on ordinary human beings. This is a unique play and in a modern dress production it is extraordinarily topical."

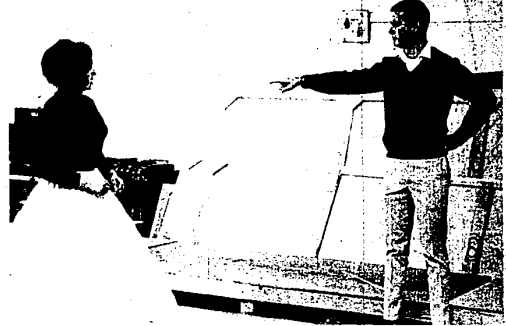
Pontiac Symphony To Present Tenor At Family Concert
