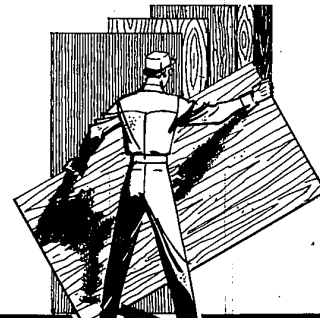

Area PTA's To Push School Finance Issue

Watch for Parent-Teacher organizations in Observerland to start passing resolutions asking Gov. Romney to appoint a study group to find ways to ease the burden of the school property tax and "unequal educational opportunity."

Sample resolutions were passed out last week to representatives of more than 100 PTA's located at a meeting in Garden City West High School.

Watch, too, for PTA members to start peppering their state legislators for action on school finance.

And watch for increased mention of something called the "Thomas Report," a \$200,000 state-financed study which earlier this year criticized present methods of school financing in Michigan.

THE THOMAS REPORT, named after the Chicago consultant who put it together, was the topic of panelists from Livonia, Farmington, Garden City and the University of Michigan at last week's session.

Dr. Don Shader, Garden City superintendent, said "the faults uncovered in the Thomas study will remain unresolved unless pressure is brought for immediate legislative action."

"We have asked the governor to form a task force—or blue ribbon committee—to study the problems faced by Michigan's public schools and to make recommendations for remedial legislation," said Shader, referring to a request by a committee of the Michigan Assn. of School Administrators.

The governor countered this request by asking the MASA to submit a more equitable distribution of funds using his new budget figures.

ROLLAND UPTON, Livonia's assistant superintendent who is due to take over the top slot in 1970, said there are unequal educational opportunities in the state.

"There could be another Jonas Salk in Hawke, Mich., attending a high school with no science lab."

Upton also said Livonians are concerned with the pending dissolution of Nankin Mills School District, which can no longer support its program despite the highest millage levy in the state.

MRS. ELIZABETH Kummer, former state PTA legislative chairman, and Gerald Harrison, retired Farmington school superintendent, were members of the so-called Britton Committee which studied the report.

Their report calls for immediate school district reorganization to reduce the number of local districts and place control closer to the intermediate (county) level.

They called for the state and local districts to share the financial burden equitably based upon effort and the ability-to-pay principle.

Dr. Russell Wilson, professor of education at the University of Michigan, said there is a need for minimum statewide standards of educational opportunity. He endorsed the MASA proposal that the governor appoint a study committee to come up with legislative proposals.

The call for local PTAs to get active in the school finance issue came from William Haydon, Garden City PTA council president; Jack Markel, G.C. PTA legislative chairman; and Mrs. Helen Nevill, PTA District II director.

Current plans, if the response from area PTAs is favorable, are to make the movement statewide.

New Cars, Stars In Spotlight At Auto Show

There'll be plenty of cars and plenty of stars at the 53rd Detroit Auto Show opening Saturday, Nov. 30 in Cobo Hall.

The cars will include 300 domestic and imported passenger cars, recreational vehicles, campers, experimental and show cars. And the stars will include Detroit Tiger pitchers Dean McLean and Mickey Lolich, wearing their "show business" hats, and a host of headlines from the sports and entertainment worlds.

The Auto Show will open at noon daily, Nov. 30 through Dec. 8, closing each night at 11 p.m. One of the largest automobile exhibits in the country, the show will cover 300,000 square feet in Cobo Hall, with a special 1,500-seat theater in Hall D for the twice-daily free stage show.

HARRY TENNYSON, Livonia Chevrolet dealer and chairman of the auto show committee for the fourth straight year, predicted a record attendance of 300,000 for the 1968 show. Tennyson based his prediction on "the tremendous increase in advance ticket sales," which so far have been running about 400 per cent ahead of last year. The 1967 Auto Show drew 253,000.

The show is sponsored annually by the Detroit Auto Dealers Association, made up of 850 franchised new car dealers in the Metropolitan Detroit area. For suburbanites, parking lots in the vicinity of Cobo Hall can accommodate 8,000 cars evenings, and 9,000 to 10,000 Saturdays and Sundays.

All American automobile manufacturers will be exhibiting at the Detroit Auto Show, along with 20 import makes.

SPECIAL exhibits will include the 640-horsepower turbo-charged racer Bobby Unser drove to victory in this year's Indianapolis 500; the Invader, the only double-engine roadster in the world; The Sand Dragon, a futuristic front-wheel drive roadster; and other experimental cars with "way-out" design.

McLean and Lolich will appear with ventriloquist Jimmy Nelson, comedian-singer Paul Lennon, and Bob Durant and his orchestra at 4 and 8 p.m. daily in Hall D theater.

Other celebrities at the various exhibits will include Bobby Unser and Indy runner-up Dan Gurney; Miss America, Judith Anne Ford; Miss American Teen-Ager, Fran Gartin; plus Gates Brown, Bill Freibahn, Willie Horton, Al Kaline, Jim Northrup, Joe Sparni, Mickey Stanley and Earl Wilson from the World Champion Detroit Tigers; and golfers Arnold Palmer, Byron Nelson and Sharron Norby; bowler Billy Welu; track star Jesse Owens; and Alex Karras and John Gordy of the Detroit Lions football team.
