Open School Monday At Clarenceville

Clarenceville schools will open Monday, it was announced this week by Walter Headler, president of the Board of Education. Delay in opening the schools has not been due to prevalence of infantile paralysis, but to the wish of the Board to avoid any alarm that might develop on the part of parents.

For two weeks rumors have been abroad that "there are seven cases of infantile paralysis in Clarenceville." Neither Dr. H. E. Boice, Township health officer, nor members of the school board have been able to locate any of them. Dr. Boice states that there are only 11 in the entire Oakland County, with not more than one in any community, and none at all in Farmington Township. How the report of "seven" in Clarenceville got started, and why "seven" and not six or eight or ten, remains a mystery.
